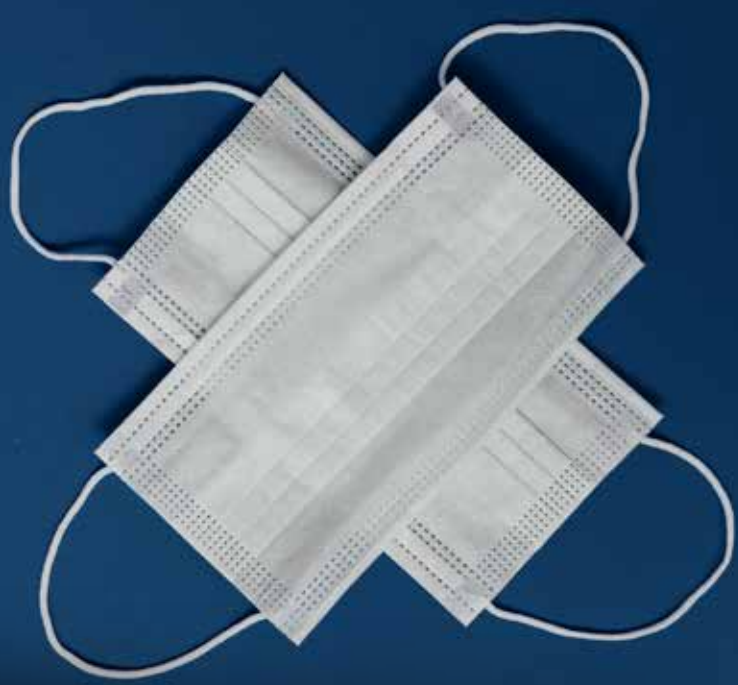


# The impact of canceling elective procedures due to COVID-19

US Surgeon General advised the **cancellation** of all **elective surgical procedures**<sup>1</sup>

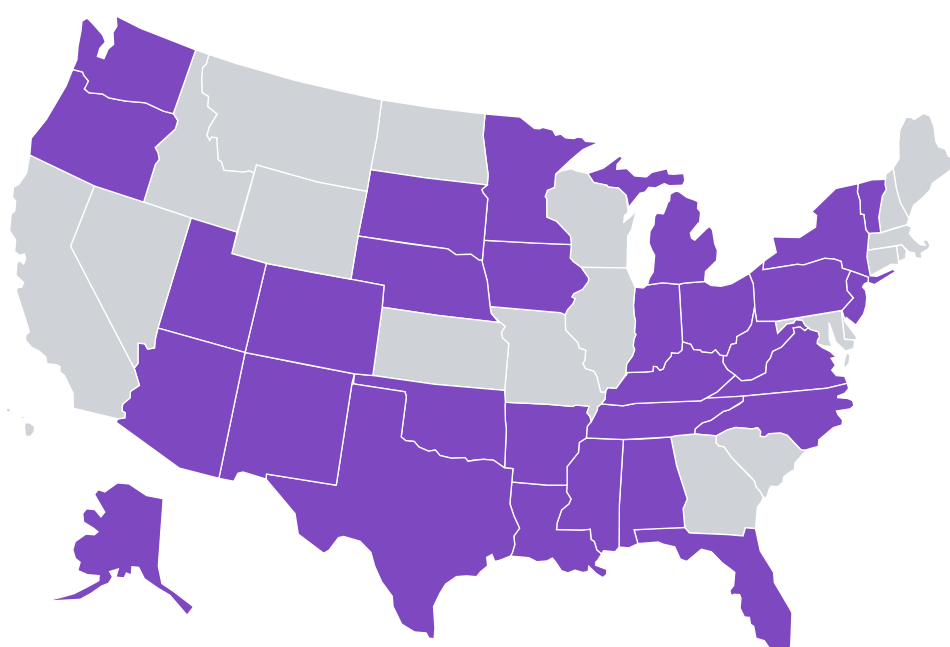
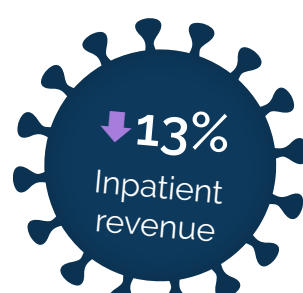
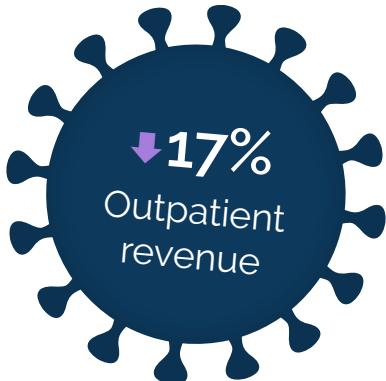
## April



### As of April 16

An estimated **2 million** surgical cases are canceled nationwide, with an average of **\$1.5 million** in revenue loss per hospital<sup>2</sup>

In the month of **March** alone, the financial impact was stark<sup>3</sup>



### As of April 21

**31 states**<sup>4</sup> had halted elective surgeries, leaving patients, surgeons, and staff in limbo

Projected net losses<sup>5</sup> from **March 1 - June 30** are sobering
